1) What is a logline?

LOGLINE: A one-sentence summary of your movie that entices someone to read the entire script. A good logline is short, sharp, and sells your story.

A logline is not:

A Synopsis

A Tagline (You'll never go in the water again!)

A Whole Paragraph

Information to include:

The main character(s)

The world they live in

The inciting incident

The major conflict they must face

The stakes at hand.

When [INCITING INCIDENT OCCURS]...

A [CHARACTER TYPE]...

Must [OBJECTIVE]...

Before [STAKES].

When a killer shark unleashes chaos on a beach community, a local sheriff, a marine biologist, and an old seafarer must hunt the beast down before it kills again.

Remember:

Less is more

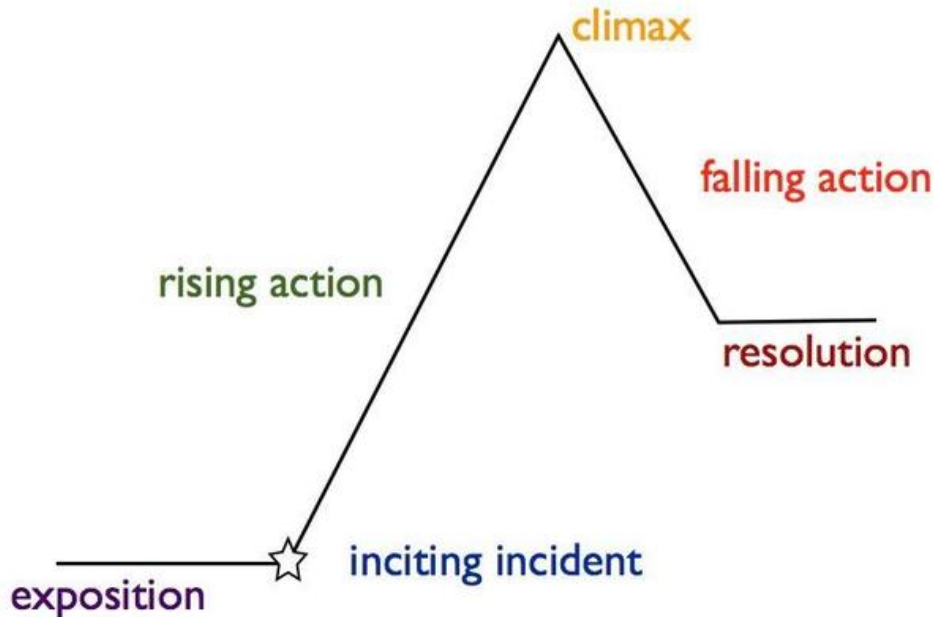
Avoid Character Names

freytag's pyramid



The five-act structure is a plot formula that divides a story into five sections: the exposition, rising action, climax, falling action, and resolution.

- Act 1: Exposition (pp. 1–25)
- Act 2: Rising Action (pp. 25–55)
- Act 3: Climax (pp. 55–75)
- Act 4: Falling Action (pp. 75–90)
- Act 5: Resolution (pp. 90–110)

What are the given circumstances?

What are my relationships and how do they affect the way I carry myself?

What do I want?

What is in my way to achieve the above?

What do I do to get what I want?

What is my attitude or perspective on the world?

What is my hereditary?

What economic status was I born into?

Where am I now? Is it the same?

What is my greatest strength and fear(s)?
 What do I depend on others for?
 What are my bias'?
 What am I guilty of?
 What principles do I live by?
 How do I comfort myself?
 Who are my friends?
 What do people rely on me for
 What are my insecurities?
 What are my weaknesses?
 What don't I want anyone to know?
 What level of education have I achieved?
 What are my attitudes and perspectives?
