
Mission





The Plan LA

In an East LA apartment, a group of young activists prepares for a violent political act: to disrupt a high-profile graduation ceremony in a coordinated attack they believe will make a lasting impact. But as the day wears on and the heat rises, cracks begin to show. Personal grievances bubble to the surface. Romantic entanglements, unresolved trauma, and doubts about the mission threaten to derail everything. Shot in a single, uninterrupted take, *The Plan* traps the audience inside the apartment with the characters as time runs out. It's a pressure-cooker thriller that morphs into a pitch-black comedy about the absurdity of idealism in a fractured world – and what happens when the people who want to change everything can't even agree on what they're fighting for. 



The Bulldogs

On February 3rd, 2023, a Norfolk Southern train derailed in the village of East Palestine, Ohio, leading to the release and burn of 1.1 million pounds of vinyl chloride, a known carcinogen. Thousands of residents were forced to evacuate. In the weeks that followed, the community found itself thrust into a media whirlwind. Overnight, the town faced a maelstrom of uncertainty and controversy, raising questions about safety, corporate responsibility, and the economic future of an already struggling community. The Bulldogs picks up as the news cameras leave, and residents struggle to resume their lives in the aftermath of the derailment. From a chiropractor-turned-activist, to the leader of an elderly dance group, The Bulldogs paints a rich and nuanced picture of a tight-knit community in crisis. [@aloosefilms](#)

Erick Oh Erick Oh is an Academy nominated filmmaker and a former Pixar animator, currently based in San Francisco and Seoul, Korea.






